2019 Highlights

On behalf of our entire team at NAEYC: Thank you for committing to your professional membership association, thank you for trusting in our content and for believing in our approach, and thank you for taking the time to attend our events and join us in our advocacy work. Each of you is what makes NAEYC the organization that it is.

2019 found us in the midst of simultaneously developing three position statements—Advancing Equity in Early Childhood Education Position Statement, Professional Standards and Competencies for Early Childhood Educators, and Developmentally Appropriate Practice in Early Childhood Programs Serving Children from Birth through Age 8. The position statement on equity was completed first and continues to have a profound influence on all of our decisions about content, professional learning and policy and advocacy.

As such, we continuously reassess our approaches to creating and promoting more diverse and equitable early learning opportunities. We dramatically expanded the diversity of contributors to our books and journals, our new learning modules in Spanish and Mandarin, and webinars on maximizing learning in diverse classrooms.

It also gives us the framework by which NAEYC can evaluate its internal organizational work on diversity and inclusion. It has caused us to evolve our evolved our hiring and procurement practices and work with our affiliates across the country as they look to increase the diversity of their governing boards.

We zeroed in on our members by distributing the first comprehensive membership survey in more than a decade. The survey had a high response rate and the results showed that members are overall satisfied with the work we do. Members reported that professional development, content, and advocacy remain the most essential value propositions for membership, and HELLO has made a substantial impact on membership value in a very short period of time.

It's always a gift to welcome thousands of early childhood educators to our Annual Conference and Professional Learning Institute.

As we continue to further our goals in early childhood education, we will keep equity at the forefront of our efforts. We are committed to ensuring that all young children have access to quality early learning, and that the educators who serve them are respected and valued as part of a diverse, well-prepared, and well-compensated profession.
