## **New System Revised Assessment Tools Released**

To help Early Learning Programs prepare for the new Quality Assessment and Accreditation System that will launch in March 2025, we have recently released revised Assessment Tools that align to the new Assessment Items. ## **New System | FAQ Highlights**

My program is in Applicant status. How long do we have to get to Candidacy if we want to be assessed under the current system?

Programs that are in "Applicant" status must declare Candidacy by **Feb. 15, 2025**, to be assessed under the current system OR they need to come in under the new system after launch.

#### Are there additional assessment items for Accreditation+?

No. The assessment items for Accreditation+ are the same as Accreditation. There is a required site visit and increased accountability protocols for Accreditation+.

My staff are asking if there is a different format for the portfolios or are they to use the 2022 format for age groups and program portfolios?

Yes. In the new system, there will be a different approach to portfolios with all documentation submitted through an online system, that is aligned to the evidence types across the new revised items. We are working on guidance on how your team can best prepare existing portfolios for the transition and plan to have that available later this fall.

My program is coming up for renewal, but we would like an extension, so we have more time to prepare. What options do we have?

If there has been no previous extension and the program is requesting a VUD extension, programs are eligible to pay for an extension. Based on the adjusted 6-month window, NAEYC will confirm whether the program is eligible for a 6-month or 12-month extension, based on the 6-month window guidance above.

## **Accreditation Tips**

## Required Item Highlight | 1B.10 - Guidance / Discipline Policy

Required Item Number 1B.10 is one of two document-based required items in the current accreditation system: "Show that your guidance / discipline policy does not include any circumstances when it is permissible for staff to use any form of physical punishment, psychological abuse, or coercion when disciplining a child. Appropriate use of restraint for safety reasons is permissible."

When completing the Program Portfolio review, NAEYC Assessors will look for a policy where it clearly indicates that the program does not use any form of physical punishment, psychological abuse, or coercion when disciplining a child. Within the Program Portfolio tool, you can find more guidance and definitions to support your program in ensuring your policy meets this item.

#### 72-Hour Incident Reports

72-Hour Notifications are required to maintain compliance with NAEYC's few, but important required practices such as lapses in supervision, child abuse or injury, or license suspensions. Within 72 hours of occurrence, the program must report any occurrences through the portal by selecting the "72 Hour Notification" tab. NAEYC Quality Assurance staff will contact the program to follow up. To report a critical incident via 72 Hour Form, please contact qualityassurance@naeyc.org to obtain a 72-hour form.
