



## How Are Blended Program Reports Different from Other Program Reports?

<p>How many assessments does the submission include?</p>	<p>Reports include 6-8 assessments to align with NAEYC standards.</p>	<p>Reports include 6-12 assessments to align with NAEYC and CEC standards.</p> <p>Some programs may include 6 assessments that align with NAEYC standards and 6 that align with CEC standards (12 assessments total).</p> <p>Other programs might include some assessments designed to meet both sets of standards (fewer than 12 assessments total).</p>
<p>What is required for national recognition?</p>	<p>To achieve national recognition, the program needs to demonstrate that it meets all NAEYC standards.</p>	<p>To achieve national recognition, the program needs to demonstrate that it meets NAEYC and CEC standards. (All NAEYC standards must be met; CEC has recently revised its policies in this area.)</p>
<p>Who is on the review team?</p>	<p>Review teams include 2-3 reviewers trained in NAEYC standards.</p>	<p>Review teams include a lead reviewer trained in NAEYC standards, an additional reviewer trained in NAEYC standards, and a reviewer trained in CEC standards.</p>
<p>Who is on the audit team?</p>	<p>Based on the decision reached by the review team and other contributing factors, most reports are then examined by an NAEYC auditor.</p>	<p>Reports are examined by a CEC auditor. Based on the decision reached by the review team and other contributing factors, most reports are then examined by an NAEYC auditor.</p>
<p>What is the reviewers'/auditors' role?</p>	<p>Reviewers/auditors determine whether the information provided supports that the program meets NAEYC standards.</p>	<p>NAEYC reviewers/auditors determine whether the information provided supports that the program meets NAEYC standards. CEC reviewers/auditors determine whether the information provided supports that the program meets CEC standards.</p>
<p>How are decisions reached?</p>	<p>The team reaches consensus on the national recognition decision and checks the report for internal consistency.</p>	<p>As with other reports, the team reaches consensus on the national recognition decision and checks the report for internal consistency.</p>
<p>What types of reports may be submitted?</p>	<p>Reports may be Option A, Option B, or Option C (if the program was previously accredited using the same set of SPA standards). Reports may be for initial or advanced programs and may be first-time submissions, revised reports, or response-to-condition reports.</p>	<p>As with other reports, blended reports may be Option A, Option B, or Option C (if the program was previously accredited using the same set of both NAEYC and CEC standards). Reports may be for initial or advanced programs and may be first-time submissions, revised reports, or response-to-condition reports.</p>
