



**NAEYC: Reunited and** it Feels So Good

### 2023 Highlights

After two years of virtual convening, we returned to an in-person Annual Conference as the effects of the pandemic began to wane. Nearly 6,000 NAEYC members—early childhood educators, early learning program directors, higher education faculty, Affiliate leaders, partners, and advocates—from all 50 states, the District of Columbia, and 32 countries joined NAEYC in November in Washington, D.C., for a joyous celebration of early childhood education.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

In total, more than 800 presenters over 500 sessions on more than 30 different topics offered members an opportunity to gather, learn, network, and grow. Among the highlights were opening session appearances by children's author and education advocate Minh Lê and hip-hop artist Darryl "DMC" McDaniels.

A hybrid Public Policy Forum included 85 presenters across 37 in-person and virtual sessions, 420 in-person attendees, 225 congressional visits, and 350 virtual congressional engagements from participants at home. NAEYC also continued surveying the early learning workforce, which showed how child care providers and families are facing deep challenges following the expiration of \$25 billion in pandemic-related child care stabilization funds.

Portland, Oregon, was the temporary home of 1,900 NAEYC members from all 50 states and beyond, who spent four days at NAEYC's Professional Learning Institute, where they made connections and obtained professional development that strengthened their practice.

Throughout the year, early childhood educators persevered in the face of such extraordinary challenges. You continue to show remarkable resilience and unwavering commitment, and we remain steadfast in our commitment to support you through our policy work, professional development opportunities, educational resources, and accreditation programs.
